The instant contempt petition was filed raising the grievance that even though the claim of the present petitioner as regards benefit of revision of pay-scale w.e.f. 01.11.1971 instead of 16.07.1975 has been admitted and even arrears have been released, yet, the necessary consequential benefits as regards gratuity, leave encashment, etc were not being released.

In the reply filed on behalf of State, a stand had been taken that an amount of Rs.6336/- as arrears of revised Death-cum-Retirement Gratuity (DCRG) have since been released.

Counsel appearing for the petitioner himself concedes that in addition thereto, even the benefit of leave encashment has been paid to the petitioner.

Counsel appearing for the petitioner, however, contends that based on the pay revision granted w.e.f. 01.11.1971 even the revised pensionary benefits have been granted to the petitioner but the arrears

accruing thereupon to be worked out with effect from the date of superannuation i.e. 31.10.1997 have not been released till date.

The instant contempt petition is disposed of with a direction that the arrears of the revised pensionary benefits would be computed and released to the petitioner within a period of two months from today.

Petition disposed of.

Rule discharged.
