Counsel for the respondents states that the bills have been prepared and submitted to the treasury for release of amount to the petitioner. He, however, states that since the financial year is closing and the payment would now be made in the next financial year, fresh approval would be required and for which, six weeks' time is required. He, on instructions from Sh. Kewal Krishan, Executive Engineer, Gurdaspur, Madhopur Division, U.B.D.C., states that the payment would be released to the petitioner within a period of seven weeks' from today.
