By this order, I propose to dispose of COCP Nos.2864, 2865, 2912, 3406 of 2014 and 471 of 2015.

COCP No.2864 of 2014

Counsel for the Board states that the costs as imposed by this Court vide order dated 11.12.2014 shall be deposited during the course of the day. He further states that respondent No.1 is present in Court.

Short affidavit of respondent No.1 is taken on record. Copy supplied to the counsel for the petitioner as also to counsel for the State. As per the short affidavit filed in Court today, the claim of the petitioner has been accepted and the matter has been referred to respondent No.2 for further consideration and approval.

Counsel for the State, on instructions from Shri S.C. Sharma, Deputy Controller, states that the order dated 15.05.2015 passed by respondent No.1 shall be duly considered and appropriate orders passed thereon within a period of four weeks from today.

In view of the above, the present contempt petition is disposed of with directions to the Secretary, Punjab School Education Board, to

release the consequential benefits to the petitioner on approval by respondent No.2 within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of said order of approval.

It shall however, be open to the petitioner to revive the present contempt petition, if the schedule given by the respondents and recorded above, is not adhered to.

COCP Nos.2865, 2912, 3406 of 2014 and 471 of 2015

Counsel for the petitioner(s) states that the orders passed by this Court have been partly complied with. However, the actual payment has to be made by the Punjab School Education Board, which till date has not been released.

In view of the above, these contempt petitions are disposed of with direction to the Secretary, Punjab School Education Board to release the consequential benefits to the petitioner(s) within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

Rule discharged.
