AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (Oral):

Counsel for the State informs the Court that as per the telephonic instructions received by him from Shri Kulwant Singh, Assistant, O/o Tehsildar, Kharar, states that the amount which the petitioner is entitled to, has been deposited in the account of petitioner as has been mentioned in Annexures R-3 and R-4.

In view of the above, the present contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous.

In case, the statement made by the counsel for the State is found to be incorrect, liberty is granted to the petitioner to revive the present contempt petition.

It has further been stated by the counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is entitled to three months salary for the notice which he had given for voluntary retirement of which the petitioner

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was called upon to deposit the said amount which was indeed deposited, whereas, the petitioner is only allowed to retire on completion of three months.

If that be so, petitioner is granted liberty to file a representation to the Deputy Commissioner, SAS Nagar, Mohali, within a period of two weeks from today who shall, on receipt of the same, decide the same within a period of four weeks from the date of submission of such representation.

In case, the representation of the petitioner is accepted, the consequential benefits be released to him within a further period of three weeks.

Rule discharged, subject to above.
