AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (ORAL)

Counsel for the respondent submits that the orders passed by this Court have been duly complied with, as on consideration of the legal notice of the petitioner, his services have been regularized. He, on instructions from Shri Surinder Dulhera, SDO, further states that after the orders of regularization of the services of the petitioner have been passed, the petitioner has also been granted the consequential benefits of pay fixation and arrears.

In view of the above statement of the counsel for the respondent, the present contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous.

Counsel for the petitioner states that liberty may be granted to the petitioner to file a representation, in case some other benefits, which the petitioner was entitled to as a consequence of regularization, have not been granted to him.

In the light of the statement made by the counsel for the

petitioner, liberty is granted to the petitioner to avail of the remedy in accordance with law, if so advised.
