The order dated 12.3.2012, non-compliance of which is alleged by the petitioner mandated the release of the pensionary dues and other retiral benefits to the petitioner upon her opening a bank account. It was noticed that the petitioner had opened a bank account. Reply indicates that needful has been done.

The petitioner agitates her right to revised pension.The writ Court does not mandate any particulars of service benefits which are to be released to the petitioner.However, if the petitioner is entitled to pension and if there has been any revision and the petitioner is entitled to it also that would naturally become her right to claim it in appropriate proceedings or by approaching the respondents.

For the present, instant contempt petition is disposed of as having

become infructuous, leaving the petitioner to her remedies to approach the

respondents with the details of the shortfalls, if any, within a period of 3 weeks from today upon which the respondents would do well to address the grievance of the petitioner in this regard at the earliest, preferably within a period of 4 weeks thereafter.
