Mr. T.L.Satya Parkash, Deputy Commissioner, Gurgaon-respondent is present in person and states that as far as the claims of the petitioner regarding Gurgaon district are concerned, the same are being taken care of and an amount of ₹ 5,000/- of missing credit of General Provident Fund, is being persuaded with the Principal Accountant General, Haryana and the same will be credited to him soon. As regards the claim of the petitioner for Mewat is concerned, the matter is being persuaded by the Deputy Commissioner, Rohtak and the same will be paid to the petitioner within a period of four weeks.

Qua the claim of the petitioner as regards the period he has spent in District Jhajjar, the said amount will have to be dealt with by the concerned Deputy Commissioner and if the petitioner approaches the Deputy Commissioner, Jhajjar, the appropriate steps will be taken, in accordance with law, as regards the said claim. He, however, points out

that as per the communication received from the Deputy Commissioner, Jhajjar, no dues of the petitioner are pending with them.

In view of the statement, which has been made by the respondent in Court, the present contempt petition is disposed of keeping the said statement in view.

As regards the claim of the petitioner for the period, he had spent in Jhajjar and was placed under suspension, he may file a representation to the Deputy Commissioner, Jhajjar, within a period of two weeks from today. If such a representation is made detailing therein the claims and the period, for which the said claims are being made, the same shall be considered and decided by the Deputy Commissioner, Jhajjar, within a period of two months from the date of submission of such representation.

In case the claim of the petitioner is accepted, the consequential benefits be released to him, in accordance with law, within a further period of four weeks.

The petition stands disposed of accordingly.
