The instant contempt petition was filed asserting non-compliance of the order dated 30.8.2012, passed by this Court.

In response to the contempt petition a status report by way of affidavit dated 8.1.2015 of the Secretary, Municipal Committee, District Rewari has been filed in Court today and the same is taken on record. Copy has been furnished to learned counsel for the petitioners.

Paras 3, 4 and 5 of such status report read in the following terms:-

“3. That in compliance of the orders dated 26.11.2014 passed by the Hon'ble High Court, the deponent humbly submits that for demolishing dangerous buildings, Duty Magistrate was appointed and police force was provided on 04.01.2015 to 06.01.2015. That demolition of the dangerous buildings mentioned at Sr. No.17 namely Shyam Electric Store (Motiram), 2366-70, Jiwali Bazar, Ward No.11, Sr. No.15 namely Sallumal s/o Parbhu Dayal, Shop No.2170, Gokal Bazar, Rewari and Sr. No.16 namely Nemi Chand s/o Mohan Lal, 1625-26, Kewal Bazar, Ward No.10 existed in busy

markets and narrow lanes, was carried out up to the extent of dangerous portion mentioned in notices already given to owners/occupants, from 04.01.2015 (Sunday) to 06.01.2015.

4. That the deponent humbly submits that repair of approx 50% of dangerous portion of the remaining building mentioned at Sr. No.13 namely Executive Officer, Wakf Board Mohalla Muftiwara, Rewari is already completed by occupants and the same is in progress for the remaining portion.

5. That the deponent humbly submits that dangerous building mentioned at Sr. No.21 namely Smt. Satyawati D/o Partap Singh, Smt. Hemlala D/p Veer Singh, Inderjeet etc. Sarai Balbhadra, Rewari for which a stay order was issued by this Hon'ble Court in CWP No.22483 of 2014, is also demolished by the owners/occupiers at their own."

This Court is satisfied that in the light of such categoric stand contained in the status report, substantial compliance of the orders passed by this Court, has been made.

No case for contempt is made out. The instant contempt petition is, accordingly, disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.

Rule discharged.
