Counsel for the respondent states that the cost amounting to ₹ 2,500/-, as imposed by this Court vide order dated 02.12.2014, shall be deposited today itself. Reply by way of short affidavit is taken on record.

Counsel for the respondent, on the basis of the said affidavit, submits that the payment due to the petitioner towards revised pension amounting to ₹ 6,01,872/- stands credited to the account of the petitioner, which fact is not disputed by the learned senior counsel for the petitioner. He, however, states that liberty may be granted to the petitioner to take appropriate steps under law for claiming interest upon the delayed payment.

In view of the above, the present contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous subject to deposit of ₹ 2,500/- as per the order dated 02.12.2014. Liberty, as prayed for by the counsel for the petitioner, is also granted.
