Counsel for the respondents states that the order passed by this Court has been duly complied with. The retiral benefits have been released to the petitioner and arrears also paid.

Counsel for the petitioner states that the present contempt petition may be disposed of in the light of the reply filed by the respondents, however, in case any other dues, which the petitioner thinks, have not been released to him, a liberty may be granted to the petitioner to file a representation, which he would file within four weeks from today, which may be directed to be considered and decided by respondent No.2 on some early date.

In the light of the above, the present contempt petition is disposed of as infructuous with liberty to the petitioner to file a

representation within a period of four weeks. If such a representation is made to respondent No.2 within the time stipulated above, the same shall be considered and decided by the said respondent within a period of eight weeks. In case of acceptance of any of the claims as made, the consequential benefits be released to the petitioner within a further period of four weeks.
