Learned counsel for the petitioners has admitted that the order passed by this Court has been duly complied with and the petitioners have been allowed to join their duties but they are aggrieved against the action of the respondents in not releasing their salaries for the period they remained out of service.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties and examining the record, I am of the considered opinion that insofar as the present petition is concerned, it has become infructuous because the order of reinstatement has been passed. In case, the petitioners do not feel satisfied because of non-payment of their salaries, they may file an application to the respondents and if such an application is filed by the petitioners, it shall be decided within a period of two months.

Dismissed as infructuous.
