AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (ORAL)

It is the contention of the counsel for the petitioner that the order passed by this Court on 09.12.2014 (Annexure P-8) has not been complied with by the respondents *in toto* till date. He contends that direction was issued to the respondents to finalize the dispute and pass orders regarding the claim of the petitioner within a period of two months from the date of the order. The claim of the petitioner for grant of promotion to the post of S.D.E. has been decided vide order dated 02.02.2015 (Annexure P-9) but the consequential benefits have not yet been released, although it is mentioned in the order that arrears of pension will be determined and revision of the current pension payable to the petitioner shall be accordingly made. He states that neither the arrears of pension nor the revision of the current pension payable to the petitioner has been given effect to.

This contention of the counsel for the petitioner cannot be accepted to be a contempt in itself as the respondent has finalized the claim of the petitioner. For the arrears of pension and the revision of the current pension, petitioner may make a representation to the respondent within a

period of two weeks from today. If such a representation is made, the same shall be considered and decided within a period of four weeks of submission of such representation. The consequential benefits be released to the petitioner within a further period of four weeks.

The contempt petition stands disposed of with above observations.
