The Writ Court mandated respondent no.1 to look into the matter, consider the grievance of the petitioner raised vide representation dated 28.06.2013 and decide the same at an early date, by passing an appropriate order thereon, in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of six months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of the order.

Grievance of the petitioner as contained in the representation dated 28.06.2013 has not been redressed. The respondent offers a justification by saying that the petitioner should deposit the required documents and in case she does so, the matter would be looked into.

The contempt petition is, therefore, disposed of with a direction to the petitioner that she should submit all the relevant documents in support of her claim to the respondents within a period of four weeks from today. Thereafter, the respondents would be duty bound to consider the case of the petitioner and take a decision thereon within four weeks thereafter.
