1. Whether Reporters of local papers may be allowed to see the judgment ?
2. To be referred to the Reporters or not ?
3. Whether the judgment should be reported in the Digest?

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K. KANNAN J. (ORAL)

1. I will not allow the revision petitioner to argue on merits in a case where the Court has recorded the concession made by the counsel on 19.04.2012 that he will be satisfied if the respondent is prepared to accommodate him in some other premises since the hospital is a six storeyed building. The respondent appearing through counsel states that they have considered the petitioner's request and it is not possible for them to accommodate him elsewhere. If the petitioner had restricted his argument only to a plea for respondent's munificence and the respondent is not prepared to accommodate him elsewhere, I do not think there is any scope for an intervention on merits.

2. I decline to entertain any plea on merits and dismiss the petition. Time to vacate the premises four months on condition that the

petitioner furnishes affidavit within a week from the date of receipt of copy of this order that he will vacate the premises and continue to pay the rent without any default. If he does not give affidavit within a week, the order of eviction will operate *eo instante* and the time granted will be taken as withdrawn.
