Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner could not produce the evidence as he is suffering from serious ailments and has produced medical record to this effect. He undertakes that the petitioner will produce entire evidence on one opportunity granted by the trial Court, at his own responsibility. It is further submitted that this is a contempt petition and in the event of evidence being not produced by the petitioner the Court would take adverse inference against him.

Without expressing any opinion on merits and to avoid unnecessary delay in issuing notice of the petition to the respondents, the same is allowed, subject to payment of ₹ 10,000/- as costs, to be deposited with the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court.

On production of receipt of deposit of the amount of ₹ 10,000/-, the trial Court will allow one opportunity to the petitioner to produce the entire evidence at his own responsibility.

It is, however, made clear that the petitioner would not be allowed any further adjournment if he fails to conclude his evidence on the date fixed by the trial Court.

In the event of respondents having any objection against this order, they may file appropriate application which would be listed by the Registry for decision on merits.
