For the reasons mentioned in the application, which is duly supported by an affidavit, the same is allowed and delay of 24 days in re-filing the revision petition is condoned.

Vide this revision petition petitioner/tenant has assailed the order dated 25.11.2014 (Annexure P-1), whereby Rent Controller, Amritsar has ordered his eviction, order dated 20.05.2015 (Annexure P-4/A), whereby warrants of possession were issued by the executing Court in the execution of the order of eviction dated 25.11.2014, as also, the order dated 28.05.2015 (Annexure P-4), vide which the application moved by the petitioner for restoration of possession had since been dismissed.

Concededly, an appeal preferred by the petitioner against the order of ejectment dated 25.11.2014, is pending consideration before the Appellate Authority for 23.11.2015. But as no stay was granted, warrants of possession was issued and the possession of the demised premises has since already been obtained by the respondent-landlord.

Having argued the matter at some length, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that let this petition be disposed of with a direction to the Appellate Authority to consider and decide his appeal on the date already fixed or within some specified time.

That being so, the revision petition is disposed with a direction to the Appellate Authority (Court of Sh.Muneesh Arora, A.D.J. (A) F.T.C, Amritsar) to decide Appeal No.135 of 2014, preferred by the petitioner on the date already fixed i.e. 23.11.2015, if possible, but positively within a period of two weeks thereafter.
