1. *Whether Reporters of Local Newspapers may be allowed to see the judgment?*

Impugned in the present revision petition is the order dated 14.08.2014 (Annexure P-6) passed by learned Civil Judge (Sr. Divn.), Ambala, vide which the application of the defendants was allowed, thereby allowing the expert of the defendants to take photographs of the document (Ex.D5) and submit the report regarding the same.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have also carefully gone through the case file.

It comes out that during the evidence of the defendants, an expert was sought to be examined after comparing the documents Ex.PW6/A and Ex.PW6/D and the photostat copies of the same i.e.

agreements dated 21.07.2007 and 05.11.2008. The handwriting expert submitted the report by stating that the signatures on Q2 to Q6 are subject to the condition that the photostat copies are the copies of the original documents. Therefore, in order to remove that confusion, the defendants wanted that the expert would take the photographs of Ex.D5 and submit the report, accordingly.

The lower court has held that the case is still at the stage of evidence of the defendants. Therefore, the said application was allowed, subject to payment of costs of ₹2,000/-.

While exercising the revisional powers, this Court does not find any illegality or infirmity in the same. When during the examination of witnesses, some vagueness is found, the party can always lead evidence to remove the ambiguity.

Hence, the present revision petition stands dismissed.
