MAHESH GROVER, J.

During the pendency of the petition, the petitioner had expired. His legal representatives were brought on record. Subsequent thereto counsel who was prosecuting the case on behalf of the petitioner also expired.

This Court had issued notice to the legal representatives of the deceased petitioner. The report has been received that the legal representatives indicated at L.R (i) to (iii) are residing abroad while the one indicated at (iv) is residing at Shimla. There is evidently no one to provide the correct addresses and pursue the matter to effect service upon the aforesaid legal representatives of the deceased petitioner. Evidently, the Court cannot proceed with the matter any further in the absence of any representation on behalf of the legal representatives of the deceased petitioner, who as indicated above cannot be served.

The instant petition is, therefore, disposed of with liberty to the legal representatives of the deceased petitioner to revive the instant petition in case they wish to pursue the same.
