The prayer in the writ petition is for issuance of a licence of stamp vendor to the petitioners who are five in number. They are aggrieved by the issue of licence only to the respondent Nos. 4 and 6 which according to them was not justified, particularly, in view of the fact that their applications were received belatedly. Admittedly, the petitioners were all interviewed along with respondent Nos. 4 and 6 and there had been a choice of only two candidates for being favoured with licences. I will find no scope for intervention at this length of time and dismiss the petition. This dismissal ought not to be taken as disqualifying them for applying any time in future for issue of stamp vending licences, if they have eligibility under the relevant rules.

Writ petition is dismissed with above observation.
