The instant petition was filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. assailing the order dated 04.02.2012 passed by the Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Dera Bassi, in the light of which, an earlier order dated 26.11.2011 granting visitation rights to the present petitioner in respect of her only child was modified and it was directed that the respondent/husband would henceforth bring the child to the Court on each and every date and the petitioner would be allowed to meet the child only in the Court room.

Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner as also for the respondent/husband, namely, Capt. Pranav Anand, respondent No. 1, are ad-idem that a compromise has been arrived at between the parties and the terms and conditions of such compromise are contained in a Section 13-B petition filed before the competent Court seeking dissolution of marriage by way of mutual consent.

Learned counsel for the petitioner makes a statement that

he does not wish to pursue the instant petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. and prays for withdrawal of the same in the light of the compromise arrived at between the parties.

Prayer is allowed.

Dismissed as withdrawn.

CRM No. 73549 of 2012

In the light of the instant order, even CRM No. 73549 of 2012 i.e. an application under Section 340 read with Section 482 Cr.P.C. filed on behalf of the respondents is disposed of as not pressed.

It is, observed that it would be open for the parties to seek revival of the instant petition as also of the application under Section 340 Cr.P.C., if the terms and conditions as contained in the compromise deed as reflected in the petition filed under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act seeking dissolution of marriage by mutual consent are deviated from.
