In compliance of the orders dated 21.5.2015 and 14.7.2015, copy of enquiry report dated 4.12.2014, filed by the learned counsel for the State in the Court today, is taken on record.

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Sewa Singh, submits that after conducting an effective investigation, final report under Section 173 (2) has already been presented before the learned court of competent jurisdiction on 28.7.2015 against Amritpal-respondent No.4, who is a proclaimed offender. He further submits that since investigation has already been concluded and challan has also been presented, present petition has been rendered infructuous and may be disposed of, as such.

Faced with the above, learned counsel for the petitioner also fairly states that let the present petition be disposed of in view of the statement made by learned counsel for the State, but petitioner may be granted liberty to pursue his other remedy, in accordance with law.

In view of the above statements made by learned counsel for the parties, present petition is disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous, however, with liberty as prayed for.
