The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C praying for issuance of appropriate directions to the official respondents to ensure a free and impartial investigation in F.I.R No.368 dated 13.12.2014 under sections 452, 323, 324, 34 I.P.C and sections 325, 326 I.P.C, registered at Police Station, Cantonment Amritsar as also to conclude the same without any delay.

In support of the prayer raised in the petition counsel would submit that the matter has already been inquired into by a senior officer of the rank of A.D.C.P, City-II, Amritsar and a report dated 2.2.2015 had been furnished in which the allegations levelled by the present petitioner have been found to be true. Contention raised is that the complainants on account of political patronage are pressurizing the petitioner to enter into a compromise and have even influenced the investigation inasmuch as a fresh inquiry has now been marked to a junior rank official.

Without going into the correctness of the averments made in the petition and without making any observations on merits, the instant petition is disposed of in terms of granting liberty to the petitioner to

approach the Commissioner of Police, Amritsar/respondent no.2 as regards his grievance and apprehension and who in turn would be obligated to look into the matter and would thereafter take steps as he may deem fit and which are warranted strictly in accordance with law.

Petition disposed of.
