Prayer in the present petition is for quashing FIR No.162 dated 24.10.2014, under Sections 307 and 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station, Mehatpur, District Jalandhar (Annexure P-1) on the basis of compromise dated 25.3.2015 (Annexure P-2).

In compliance of the order dated 08.4.2015, this Court has directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Court for recording their respective statements with regard to compromise/settlement. Pursuant thereto, the parties have appeared before the learned Magistrate on 24.4.2015 for getting their statements

recorded.

The report received from the learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Nakodar, reveals that the compromise effected between the parties is voluntarily and the same is genuine.

Learned State counsel does not dispute the aforesaid factual position, rather admit the factum of compromise effected between the parties.

Heard.

Since the parties have entered into a compromise and learned Magistrate has recorded their statements followed by her report, continuation of the trial arising out from the impugned FIR and consequential proceedings would be sheer abuse of the process of law since chances of the conviction are bleak.

Keeping in view the factum of compromise effected between the parties dated 25.3.2015 and the law laid down by this Court in the case of **Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another 2007(3) RCR (CrI.) 1052 (P & H)**, this petition is accepted and the FIR No.162 dated 24.10.2014, under Sections 307 and 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station, Mehatpur, District Jalandhar and the consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed.
