1. Whether Reporters of local papers may be allowed to see the judgment?

AJAY TEWARI, J. (Oral)

Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 482 of the Cr.P.C. is for quashing of the order dated 07.03.2014 passed by the Judicial Magistrate, Ist Class, Panipat and the order dated 31.05.2014 passed by the Additional Sessions Judge, Panipat, thereby permission has been denied to compare the signatures of the complainant and to examine the handwriting expert on the ground that the application did not even make any sense.

Having gone through the application (Annexure P-2) for seeking permission to compare the signatures, I find that it is correct.

Nothing is mentioned as to why the handwriting expert has to be examined

and which signature was disputed. Not only that, in the revision the petitioner made a false averment that the application was allowed at one stage and rather gave a date of order also.

Consequently, both on the ground of moving an application which was ununderstandable and on the ground of over-reaching the Court by making a false averment, the impugned orders deserve to be upheld.

Petition is dismissed.

Since the main case has been decided, the pending Criminal Misc. Application, if any, also stands disposed of.
