MAHESH GROVER, J.

The petitioners pray for grant of anticipatory bail in terms of Section 438 Cr.P.C in case FIR no. 422 dated 28.10.2014 registered under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471, 506 IPC at Police Station Sadar Sonapat.

The petitioners are alleged to have duped the complainant into parting with money on the assurance of giving him job.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that no role has been attributed to petitioner no.1 in the FIR and the entire gamut of allegations is false. It is thus contended that petitioner no.1 has been falsely implicated for no fault of his and that he is willing to abide by the terms of Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the respondents on the other hand contends that the petitioner no.1 is functioning with various names and is involved in giving out repeated advertisements to dupe people on the pretext of getting them jobs.

On due consideration of the matter and noticing the fact that such matters need a deeper probe as it is a question of joining the dots. At this stage of the proceedings, it will be very difficult to accept the plea of innocence and false implication of the petitioner no.1. Hence, I am of the view that enlarging petitioner no.1 on bail in terms of Section 438 Cr.P.C is likely to hamper the investigation. Therefore, petition qua petitioner no.1 is dismissed.

As far as petitioner no.2 is concerned it has been stated by the learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Mukesh Kumar, P.S. Sadar, Sonapat that petitioner no.2 is not required for investigation. Hence, petition qua him is accepted. He is directed to be released on bail subject to his complying with provisions of Section 438(2) Cr.P.C

Petition stands disposed of .
