Petitioner Raman alias Ghora has preferred this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C., seeking regular bail in case FIR No.30 dated 25.01.2013, registered at Police Station Samalkha, District Panipat, under Sections 323, 506, 34, 307, 302 IPC.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Mr. Deepak Grewal, DAG, Haryana, has accepted notice on behalf of respondent-State and contested this petition. Police record is also available.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

The petitioner is not named in the FIR. No specific injury has also been attributed to him in the FIR. However, at the time of arguments, learned State counsel stated that the present petitioner was nominated in this case on the basis of disclosure statement of co-accused. The petitioner was stated to be armed with 'dang' and injury with 'dang' is attributed to him. Perusal of the record shows that the petitioner is not the main accused. The main accused in this

case is co-accused Rinku. The petitioner is in custody since 05.02.2013. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the disposal of the case.

Therefore, keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case and without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merit of the case, the present petition is accepted and the petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing bail bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate, Panipat.
