This petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. has been filed by the petitioner for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.61 dated 24.07.2014 under Sections 304, 34, 304-A IPC, Police Station Jhander, District Amritsar Rural.

The version of prosecution is that the deceased was a drug addict and sent to rehabilitation centre by his father. After getting treatment, he came back. The deceased was taken in the car by Ravinder Singh and thereafter due to over-dose of drug, he died.

Initially, FIR was registered under Section 304-A IPC, but during

investigation Section 304 was added. However, on further investigation, supplementary challan was prepared and Section 304-A IPC was added.

The name of petitioner cropped up in statement of Mandeep Singh son of Baldev Singh that petitioner was also in the car in which he was taken by Ravinder Singh co-accused. Main allegation is against Ravinder Singh. Petitioner is in custody from 27.07.2014.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties, without commenting on the merits of the case, keeping in view the fact that the trial will take time in conclusion, the instant petition is allowed and petitioner-Rajbir Singh @ Raju be admitted to bail on furnishing bail bonds to the satisfaction of trial Court.
