As reported by the Registry, service of respondents is complete as regards respondents No.1 to 6. None has appeared on behalf of respondents No.4 to 6 who are parents and brother of petitioner No.1 Balwinder Kaur. Respondent No.7 has not been served but she is said to be some relative of petitioner No.1.

According to the affidavit furnished by Balwinder Kaur (petitioner No.1), her date of birth is 03.03.1993 and she is a major girl. Similarly, as per the copy of the Aadhaar Card submitted by Jaimal Singh (petitioner No.2), his date of birth is 18.09.1989 and he is a major boy. The petitioners are stated to have married according to the Sikh rites i.e. by way of Anand Karaj and copy of the marriage certificate alongwith photographs of marriage have been produced. Without expressing any opinion with

regard to validity of the marriage and on the merits of the allegations made, the instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent no.2, Senior Superintendent of Police (Rural), Amritsar, that in case petitioners appear and move application seeking protection for their life and liberty, he will look into the matter and provide necessary protection to them, if he is satisfied that the life and liberty of the petitioners is in danger at the hands of respondents no.4 to 7.
