Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.72 dated 26.02.2015, under Section 420 of Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Civil Lines Amritsar, District Amritsar.

Following order was passed by this Court on 28.05.2015:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that as per the compromise the entire amount has been paid by the petitioner to the complainant and the written compromise has been handed over to the Investigating Officer.

On instructions from ASI Charanjit Singh, learned State counsel accepts having received the written compromise.

Posted to 13.08.2015.

In the meantime, in the event of his arrest the petitioner will be admitted to interim bail to the

satisfaction of Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer subject to the following conditions:

- i) he shall make himself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required;*
- (ii) he shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him/her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer; and*
- (iii) he shall not leave India without the previous permission of the Court.”*

Learned State counsel who is assisted by Head Constable Vijay Kumar has submitted that the petitioner has joined investigation and is not required for further investigation.

Accordingly, interim bail granted by this Court to the petitioner vide order dated 28.05.2015, is made absolute.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
