By way of the present petition filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, the petitioner has sought release of his Death-cum-Retirement Gratuity to the tune of Rs.62,700/-.

There is no representation on behalf of the petitioner.

The learned State counsel submits that the grievance of the petitioner stands fully redressed as the gratuity amounting to Rs.62,700/-, has been paid to him on 11.04.2001. The petitioner is also getting full pension w.e.f. 1.02.1991. The learned counsel, thus, submits that the present petition has been rendered infructuous.

In view of the above statement made by learned State counsel, the present petition is dismissed of as having become

infructuous.

However, as the petition is being disposed of without the assistance of the learned counsel for the petitioner, the liberty is granted to the petitioner to revive the present petition if the statement made by the learned State counsel is against the record or in case, any issue raised by him remains unaddressed.
