RAJ MOHAN SINGH, J.

Petitioner seeks regular bail in FIR No.502 dated 6.12.2014 registered under Sections 148/ 149/ 323/ 307/ 506 IPC and under Sections 25/ 27/ 54/ 59 of the Arms Act, Police Station Saran District Faridabad.

Learned senior counsel for the petitioner states that this is a case of version and cross-version. Complainant party is also facing prosecution under Section 307 IPC. The place of occurrence is a common street where Pardeep was urinating in front of the house of Abhimanyu. On being objected, he brought 10-15 persons named in

the FIR. The injury attributed to the petitioner is a fire arm injury hitting stomach of the injured according to prosecution version. Learned counsel states that as per MLR, injury No.1 is described as 0.5 cm semi circular wound c blackening (peritoneal) and inverted margins over lateral aspect of left upper thigh.

Learned counsel also relies upon the treatment chart, showing that at the time of discharge of the injured on 12.12.2014, the damage to femoral vein stood repaired. From the side of the petitioner, Sandeep Kumar received depressed fracture of parietal region. Petitioner is in custody since 18.12.2014.

Aggression on behalf of either side would remain as debatable issue at trial. At this stage, let the petitioner be enlarged on regular bail subject to his furnishing adequate bail bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Faridabad.

Nothing expressed hereinabove shall be taken to be an opinion on merits of the case.

Petition stands disposed of.
