The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. praying for the issuance of directions to the official respondents to provide adequate police protection to the petitioners as they apprehend threat to their lives and liberty at the hands of private respondents.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has been heard and pleadings on record have been perused.

Pleadings from the record would reveal that respondents No. 8 and 9 are the owners of Lilly Resorts situated at Khamanaon, Tehsil Fatehgarh Sahib and the petitioners are stated to be lessees of such premises. It has also been averred that a lease deed for a term of 5 years and 9 months i.e. from 01.04.2014 to 18.12.2019 has been entered into.

Apparently, there is a dispute between the landlords i.e. the private respondents herein and the tenants i.e. the petitioners herein. It also stands conceded that even a civil suit for permanent

injunction in the Court of Civil Judge (Sr. Divn.), Fatehgarh Sahib already stands instituted.

The matter essentially pertains to a civil dispute between the parties.

No directions as such would be required to be passed by this Court in exercise of its powers under Section 482 Cr.P.C. It would always be open for the petitioners to avail of their remedy in the light of civil proceedings that already stand initiated.

Present petition is, accordingly, dismissed.
