Instant petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for directing respondent nos. 1 to 4 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner from respondent nos. 5 to 7.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has already moved a complaint dated 27.02.2015 (Annexure P/2) to respondent no.2 – Inspector General of Police, UT, Chandigarh, but no action has been taken against the culprits. Learned counsel relies upon the photographs (Annexure P/1 Colly) to contend that her house has been burnt by the private respondents.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioner and after perusing the paper-book, however, without commenting on merits of the case, instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent no.3 –

Senior Superintendent of Police, U.T. Chandigarh, to look into the grievance of the petitioner specifically made in complaint dated 27.02.2015 (Annexure P/2) and take action in accordance with law. Needful shall be done within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order and copy of the order so passed shall be communicated to the petitioner.
