RAMESHWAR SINGH MALIK, J. (Oral)

Petitioner seeks pending bail trial in FIR No.214 dated 25.11.2014 registered under Section 304 of the Indian Penal Code at Police Station Sultanpur Lodhi, District Kapurthala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner has been falsely implicated. There is no direct allegation against the petitioner. She has been made an accused only because of her alleged rivalries. He prays for allowing the present petition.

On the other hand, learned counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Lakhwinder Singh, Police Station, Sultanpur Lodhi, District Kapurthala, submits that petitioner as well as her daughter have been indulging in dealing with drugs. Daughter of the petitioner has been arrested in another FIR under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985. Custodial interrogation of the petitioner would be required to know the source from where they have been getting the drugs for further supply.

She prays for dismissal of the petition.

Having heard the learned counsel for the parties, after careful perusal of record of the case and giving thoughtful consideration to the rival contentions raised, this Court is of the considered opinion that in the given fact situation of the present case noticed hereinabove, instant one has not been found to be a fit case for the concession of anticipatory bail. Keeping in view the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case, custodial interrogation of the petitioner seems to be a compulsive necessity of the investigating agency for conducting an effective investigation. No case for anticipatory bail is made out.

Dismissed.
