Prayer in this petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of F.I.R. No.205 dated 22.11.2014 under Sections 341, 353, 186, 379, 332 and 506 read with Section 34 IPC registered at Police Station Fatehgarh Sahib, District Fatehgarh Sahib (Annexure P-1) and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 26.11.2014 (Annexure P-2).

This Court vide order dated July 21, 2015 had directed the parties to appear before the trial Court to get their statements recorded and the trial Court was directed to submit its report regarding genuineness of compromise.

Pursuant to the aforesaid order, the parties have appeared before learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Fatehgarh Sahib and have got their statements recorded. On the basis of the statements so recorded by the parties, learned Magistrate has submitted his report dated 13.8.2015 to the effect that the compromise has been arrived at between the parties voluntarily, without any pressure, coercion or undue influence.

The aforesaid fact as well as the compromise between the parties has not been disputed by learned State counsel as well as learned counsel for respondent No.2-complainant.

In view of the above, no useful purpose would be served to continue with the proceedings before the trial Court in the instant F.I.R.

Following the principles laid down by the Full Bench judgment of this Court in ***Kulwinder Singh and others Versus State of Punjab and another 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052*** and approved by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in ***Gian Singh Versus State of Punjab and others (2012) 10 SCC 303***, this petition is allowed and F.I.R. No.205 dated 22.11.2014 under Sections 341, 353, 186, 379, 332 and 506 read with Section 34 IPC registered at Police Station Fatehgarh Sahib, District Fatehgarh Sahib

(Annexure P-1) and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom is quashed, on the basis of compromise dated 26.11.2014 (Annexure P-2).
