Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 438 CrPC is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.17 dated 5.2.2015 under Sections 452/324/323/34 IPC (Sections 452 and 34 IPC deleted and Section 326 IPC added later on) registered at Police Station Raman, District Bathinda.

This Court vide order dated 15.5.2015 has granted interim bail to the petitioner subject to his joining investigation and complying with provisions of Section 438(2) CrPC.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Manjit Singh, submits that though the petitioner has joined investigation, but the injury caused by the petitioner is serious in nature and therefore, he does not deserve the concession of anticipatory bail.

Mr. PKS Phoolka, Advocate appearing on behalf of the injured-complainant submits that it is in view of injury caused to the complainant, the offence under Section 326 IPC has been added at later stage.

Considering the nature of injury attributed to the petitioner, which is serious in nature, no case for anticipatory bail is made out.

Dismissed.
