Learned counsel for the petitioner states that Section 326 of the Indian Penal Code (in short, 'IPC') has been added subsequently, therefore, the same may be read in the head-note and prayer clause of petition.

In view of oral request made by learned counsel for the petitioner, it is directed that Section 326 of IPC be read in the head-note and prayer clause of petition. Registry is directed to carry out necessary corrections in this petition.

Present petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in a case

arising out of FIR No.54 dated 14.05.2014, registered at Police Station Bullowal, District Hoshiarpur, under Sections 307, 326 (added later on), 324, 323, 341, 148 and 149 of IPC.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that charge has been framed and the petitioner has been behind bars since 14.05.2014. Learned counsel further contends that the petitioner is not required for custodial interrogation.

Taking into consideration the facts and circumstances of the case and the fact that trial would not be concluded in near future, the petitioner can be granted concession of bail.

Without expressing any opinion on merits of the case, the petition is allowed. Petitioner is ordered to be released on bail, on his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds, to the satisfaction of trial Court/Duty Magistrate, Hoshiarpur.
