JASPAL SINGH, J. (ORAL)

This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No.66 dated April 10, 2013, under Sections 420, 467, 468 and 471 IPC registered at Police Station Samrala, District Khanna (Annexure P-1) on the basis of compromise, along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom.

2. Report of learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Samrala has been received, in which, it has been categorically observed that parties have compromised the dispute voluntarily, without any pressure, coercion or inducement. The same is genuine one. Even otherwise, matter involved in these proceedings is personal in nature, which has been amicably put at rest.

3. So, in view of circumstances narrated above as well as the observations made in case reported as **Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**; 2012(4) RCR(Criminal) 543, I am of the considered opinion that continuation of criminal proceedings between the parties would be an abuse of the process of law and the present compromise is for the benefit of the parties and would certainly bring peace and harmony between them.

4. Consequently, instant petition stands allowed and FIR No.66 dated April 10, 2013, under Sections 420, 467, 468 and 471 IPC registered at Police Station Samrala, District Khanna (Annexure P-1) passed by learned Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Samrala and all subsequent proceedings arising out of the same are quashed qua the petitioner.
