**MAHESH GROVER, J.**

The petitioners on an earlier occasion were granted the concession of surrendering before the learned trial Court upon which their arrest was to remain stayed. They have not done so. There is thus absolutely no occasion to exercise equitable discretion in their favour once they have defaulted in complying with the terms of the earlier order.

However, in case they surrender themselves before the learned trial Court and make a prayer for regular bail, the same shall be decided as expeditiously as possible but not later than two days from the receipt of such a prayer.
