Learned counsel for the petitioner has reiterated his argument that under the law, partial compromise is sufficient to seek quashing of the FIR for which he relies upon **2013(4) Supreme Court Cases (Criminal) 668** titled ***Jayrajsinh Digvijaysinh Rana Versus State of Gujarat and another.***

Learned counsel for the State states that, in fact, the petitioner has entered into a compromise only with Ashish Sharma, Gursewak Singh and Nanak Singh whereas there are total seven complainants in the FIR. He further submits that either all the seven complainants should depose in favour of the compromise or the present petition can be adjudicated only on merits.

Faced with this situation, learned counsel for the petitioner does not press the present petition and wishes to withdraw the same, but seeks indulgence of this Court to revive the earlier petition bearing No.CRM-M-18941 of 2010 for quashing of the FIR which was otherwise filed on merits and was withdrawn at that stage on the premises that the matter has been compromised with the aforementioned complainants.

Treating the prayer of the learned counsel for the petitioner to be just and fair, this Court grants liberty to the petitioner to revive CRM-M-18941 of 2010.

Since out of the seven complainants, only three complainants have named the petitioner, the personal appearance of the petitioner is exempted before the trial Court.

With these observations, the present petition is dismissed as withdrawn.
