1. Whether the Reporters of local newspaper may be allowed to see the judgment ?
2. To be referred to the Reporter or not.
3. Whether the judgment should be reported in the digest ?

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KULDIP SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Pursuant to the order dated 13.6.2013, passed by this Court, the report of the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Rupnagar, received to the effect that the statements of the complainant as well as the accused have been recorded. The learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Ropnagar, has reported that the compromise was entered between the parties out of their free will and consent and that if compromise is accepted, it would be beneficial to the interest of both the parties.

In this case, the allegations were payment of Rs. 16.50 lacs on account of agreement of sale and non execution of sale deed. It was a monetary dispute.

Since the parties have amicably settled the dispute, therefore, FIR No. 34, dated 23.3.2012, registered under Sections 406, 420, 120-B IPC at Police Station Kurali, District S.A.S. Nagar (Mohali) (Annexure-P-1) alongwith all the consequential proceedings arising therefrom stand quashed.

Petition is accordingly allowed.
