Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court, by way of instant petition under Sections 482 Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the petitioners, at the very outset, fairly states that before filing the present petition, petitioners did not approach the concerned police authorities. He submits that since the local police was hands in glove with the private respondents, petitioners could not approach the police authorities. However, he submits that given an opportunity, petitioners shall approach the Senior Superintendent of Police (Rural), Amritsar-respondent No.3 by moving an appropriate representation within a period of one week from today and he may be directed to consider and decide the same, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the Senior Superintendent of Police (Rural), Amritsar-respondent No.3 is directed that if the petitioners approach him by moving an appropriate representation within a period of one week from today, he shall consider and decide the same, at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law, but in any case within a period of three weeks from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioners.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, present petition stands disposed of.
