This is a petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, for quashing of FIR No. 209 dated 16.07.2006, under Sections 419, 420, 467, 468, 471, 120-B IPC registered at Police Station City Sunam, District Sangrur, on the basis of compromise, along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom.

Reply filed by the State today, is taken on record.

The allegations made in the FIR by the complainant was that his land has been sold by someone, who had impersonated him and the impersonator was petitioner No.1-Raj Singh. The other accused were the persons who had purchased the land.

It is submitted that now compromise is arrived and the land returned to the complainant.

In terms of the order passed by this Court on 17.10.2014, Sub-Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Sunam recorded the statements of the

complainant and also of the petitioners, where the complainant had stated that the matter stood compromised and and he does not want to proceed further with the present FIR and he has no objection if the same is quashed. Report as sought has been submitted by Sub-Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Sunam.

It has been stated by counsel for the parties that the parties have compromised the matter. In view of this, there should not be any impediment in allowing the parties to compromise the matter. Support to this view can be had from the authority **Madan Mohan Abbot vs. State of Punjab, 2008 (2) RCR (Criminal) 429.**

In view of the above, the petition is accepted. The above-said FIR and the proceedings connected therewith are hereby quashed.

Disposed of.
