Petitioners have filed this petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.21 dated 29.01.2015, under Sections 306/34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station GRP Hisar, District GRP Ambala Cantt.

While issuing notice of motion, following order was passed by this Court on 27.05.2015:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioners states that there was a matrimonial discord between petitioner No.1 and her husband Surender (since deceased) which led to separation, however due to intervention of respectables and ultimately by good offices of Family Courts, petitioner No.1 and deceased Surender started living together for the last three months prior to death of Surender. Allegations of

quarrel between the couple are alleged for committing suicide by Surender by jumping before a train.

Learned counsel further states that filing of application under Section 125 Cr.P.C. and moving compliant before the Women Cell are the normal features arising out of matrimonial discord and those cannot be treated to an abetment for committing suicide by husband. Ingredients in terms of Section 306 IPC are missing altogether.

Notice of motion for 13.08.2015.

At this stage, Mr. Shashikant Gupta, Advocate appears on behalf of the complainant.

Meanwhile, in the event of arrest, petitioners shall be admitted to interim bail, subject to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, petitioners shall abide by the conditions incorporated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned State counsel who is assisted by Assistant Sub Inspector Balwant Singh has submitted that petitioners have joined investigation and are not required for further investigation.

Accordingly, interim bail granted to the petitioners by this Court vide order dated 27.05.2015, is made absolute.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
