1. The petition is for issuance of directions to the Investigating Officer to release the petitioner on bail in the event of her arrest in case FIR No.28, dated 13.03.2015, registered under Section 306 IPC at Police Station City Hoshiarpur, District Hoshiarpur.

2. On a suicide note left by the deceased that the petitioner and his daughter-in-law were responsible for his death, a complaint has been registered brought at the instance of the son of the deceased. The allegation is that the daughter-in-law of the deceased wanted divorce from his another son and the petitioner and the wife

of the brother of the complainant caused threats to the deceased and gave him beatings to forcibly secure divorce. This, according to the complainant, was the proximate cause for the death.

3. The petitioner is not in any way related to the family. The wife of the brother of the complainant is reported to have been taken into custody. I do not think that any confinement of the petitioner would be necessary and it would be sufficient if the petitioner gives appropriate cooperation and join in the investigation.

4. In the even of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail subject to the following conditions:-

- i) that the petitioner shall make herself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required;
- ii) that the petitioner shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer;
- iii) that the petitioner shall not leave India without the previous permission of the Court.

5. Petition stands allowed on the above terms.
