Instant petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No. 17, dated 06.02.2015, under Sections 307, 324, 323, 148, 149 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Cantt. Ferozepur, District Ferozepur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that actually there is no injury on the chest of the complainant. It is on the elbow of the complainant.

Perusal of the FIR shows that petitioner has been attributed injuries with kirch on the chest of the complainant. As per medical report (Annexure P/2), the injuries are as under:-

“1. 12x6 cm R.A. + around (L) upper chest + obliquely around the ant. border of axilla.

2. 8x4 cm R.A. + over (L) shoulder.
3. 10x6 cm, 15x4 cm, 8x4 cm R.A. + at the back.
4. 16x3 cm. R.A. + over (L) side of abdomen.
5. 7x2 cm. I.W + on the lat. Aspect of (L) forearm, + 3 cm below the elbow. Fresh bleeding + Adv. X-ray.”

In view of the fact that petitioner has been attributed injuries with kirch on the chest of the complainant, which is a vital part, no ground for grant of anticipatory bail is made out.

Dismissed.
