Instant petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No. 6, dated 02.04.2015, under Sections 419, 420, 465, 467, 468, 471, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station NRI, Ludhiana.

There are serious allegations against the petitioner that property of one Ajit Singh, who happened to be NRI, has been sold by impersonation. Perusal of the FIR and order dated 15.05.2015 passed by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Ludhiana reveals that petitioner was one of the attesting witness with regard to the execution of the sale deed. It is common in the State of Punjab that property of NRIs are sold in this fashion. Resultantly, the NRIs suffer for this and they have to approach

various Courts for redressal of their grievances.

Since the petitioner is involved in execution of sale deed by impersonation who has been identified the impersonator as Ajit Singh, no ground for grant of anticipatory bail is made out.

Dismissed.
