Feeling aggrieved against the alleged inaction on the part of respondent authorities, petitioners have approached this Court by way of instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C., for issuance of appropriate directions.

Learned counsel for the petitioners, at the very outset, fairly states that since before approaching this Court by way of instant petition, petitioners could not approach the concerned police authorities, at the first instance, he may be granted permission to withdraw the present petition with liberty to the petitioners to approach the Commissioner of Police, Amritsar-respondent No.2 by moving an appropriate representation and he may be directed to consider and decide the same, within a reasonable time.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the Commissioner of Police, Amritsar-respondent No.2 is directed that if the petitioners approach him by way of moving an appropriate representation within a period of two weeks from today raising their grievance, he shall consider and decide the same at an early date by passing an appropriate order thereon, strictly in accordance with law but in any case within a period of three weeks from the date of receipt of representation from the petitioners.

With the above-said observations made and directions issued, the present petition stands disposed of.
