RAJIV NARAIN RAINA, J.(Oral)

This is petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. praying for directions to respondents No.2 and 3 to complete the investigation and present the challan and report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. in cross case of FIR No.214 dated 17.9.2014 registered under Sections 148, 149, 323, 324, 325, 341, 427, 452 and 506 IPC and Sections 25/54/59 Arms Act at PS Sadar, Yamunanagar.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court, Ms.Tanushree Gupta, DAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the respondents.

Looking to the FIR No.214 dated 17.9.2014 registered under various sections of the IPC and the Arms Act and its cross-version, in what

appears to be a free fight between two communities where the provisions of the Prevention of Damage to Public Property Act and The Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 have been invoked against the petitioner and others.

Mr.Sunil K. Nehra appearing for the petitioner complains that in the cross-case, the police has taken no action and this is not a fair deal.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, lest it should prejudice the rights of either of the parties, the S.P. Yamunanagar is directed to look into the matter in right earnest and treat this petition as a representation and consider the grievance of the petitioner and decide the same within one month in accordance with law after hearing the petitioner.

With the abovesaid observations made and directions issued, the petition stands disposed of.
