Report dated 07.07.2015 of learned Judicial Magistrate 1<sup>st</sup>

Class, Bathinda has been received whereby after recording statements of complainant Pooja @ Jasvir Kaur and the accused persons namely Kuldeep Singh, Ujjagar Singh, Charanjit Kaur and Jaswinder Singh @ Raju, the Court has shown its satisfaction that the compromise has been arrived at voluntarily, out of free will of the parties, without any undue influence, coercion or pressure.

Heard.

In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court, being a pure matrimonial dispute and the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out differences for betterment of future life of the parties and in view of the law laid down in '**Gian Singh v. State of Punjab and another**' 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and '**Kulwinder Singh and others v. State of Punjab and another**' 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052, the prayer made in the petition is allowed, proceedings by way of FIR No.4 dated 03.02.2015 registered at Police Station Women, District Bathinda under Sections 406/498-A IPC and all consequences arising out of the said FIR qua the petitioners are quashed.

The petition stands allowed in those terms.
